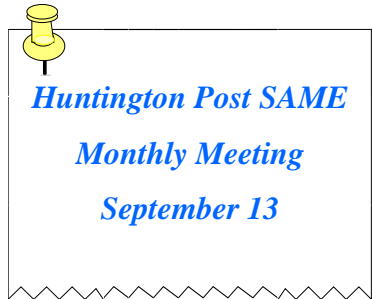

HUNTINGTON, W.Va. – Ed Stowasser with the Huntington District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers participated in the 2011 Emerging Leaders Program held in New Orleans July 29 – Aug. 5. He attended the three-day leadership training course with 50 other Corps representatives.

The Emerging Leaders program provides a forum for participants to have a unique experience to identify their individual strengths and constraints. The Corps of Engineers supports the program in order to build the bench of the next generation of leaders.

Each year participants are selected from enthusiastic and dedicated Corps personnel. Stowasser was nominated due to his demonstrated leadership, management and development, as well as his hard work and dedication for the mission of the Huntington District. He said, "I'm thankful for the opportunity to further develop and improve my leadership skills, while also having the opportunity to network with other emerging leaders and senior leaders."

## Huntington Post Joins SAME HQ and 3/4 Million Other Groups on *LinkedIn*

The Huntington Post has joined "LinkedIn" to establish an on-line forum for discussions, news, and networking. An internet-based site for business people to connect and interact, LinkedIn boasts 120 million members from more than 200 countries and adds a new recruit every second.

Kerry Ballew, the Post's publicity chairwoman and owner of DynaGlobe LLC, remarked, "We have to find ways to drive appropriate traffic to our web site, but LinkedIn will do a lot of the work for us. And because LinkedIn focuses on professionals, it will give us a different slant of exposure than Facebook, which gears itself toward social networking.

"We'll continue to maintain both our web site and our Facebook page, though — the former gives us a strong on-line presence, particularly in search engines such as Google, and the latter does a great job of connecting us with high school and college students who attend our events."

The Huntington Post group appears on LinkedIn under the name *Huntington (WV) Post, Society of American Military Engineers*.

"The actual page link is pretty long," said Ballew. "I recommend either going to [www.linkedin.com](http://www.linkedin.com) and then searching for 'Huntington Post', or email me at [kerry.ballew@dynaglobe.us](mailto:kerry.ballew@dynaglobe.us) and I'll send you an invitation with a hyperlink in it."

For anyone new to cyberspace, Ballew recommended a few cautions. "Once you join, you'll be asked to set up your 'profile'; when you do, you may wish to edit your 'settings'." To do so, look for your name in the upper right-hand corner of the screen, after you log in — click on the down arrow, then click on "settings". To establish maximum control, customize the options under each of four tabs [*Profile; Email Preferences; Groups, Companies, & Applications; and Account*].

"If you don't customize your settings, you could end up getting spam or sharing more information with the world than you intended," Ballew stated. "For me, the most irksome pre-selected option would have allowed my photo to appear on the site as an endorsement for ads of companies I'm following or services I've recommended." Users can opt out of such advertising under the *Account* tab; also, options under the *Profile* tab can turn off activity broadcasts so the site doesn't notify other members every time a profile changes even slightly.

"Otherwise, I encourage everyone to stop by the site and check out the Post's inaugural post, so to speak," joked Ballew. "And congratulations to Corey Weaver, who will go down in the annals of history as our first official group-page member; he beat out Chris Blevins by several minutes!"

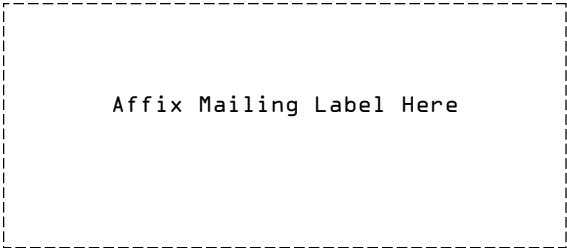
